The Cane Creek Water & Sewer District Board met for a regular meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioner's Meeting Room of the Henderson County Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Moyer called the meeting to order.

Commissioner McGrady made the motion for the Board to convene as Cane Creek Water & Sewer District Board. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

MINUTES

Commissioners McGrady made the motion to approve the minutes of September 8, 2009 and September 16, 2009. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REPLACE SNOWBALL LANE WITH GRAVITY SEWER – GRANT APPLICATION FOR HAZARD MITIGATION FUNDS

County Engineer Marcus Jones stated during the significant rainfall event on May 14, 2009, the District's Snowball Lane Pump Station was flooded and a sanitary sewer overflow of approximately 2,000 gallons occurred. In accordance with the District's responsibilities under our permit with DENR, we investigated possible actions to prevent future overflows.

William R. Buie, P.E. with William G. Lapsley & Associates, P.A. provided details of the recommendation from staff and Mr. Buie. They recommend replacing the pump station with a gravity line and apply for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Funds to fund the project. The total project cost is estimated to be \$652,040 with the District's local match of 25% being \$163,010. Our recent rate analysis during the basin study clearly indicates this expenditure is viable within the District's Enterprise Fund balance. In addition to the benefit of addressing the overflow problem, the District's operating expenses will be reduced with this project; gravity sewer is much less expensive to maintain than a pump station.

Staff request approval for the County Engineer to execute the grant application for FEMA Hazard Mitigation funds for the replacement of the Snowball Lane Pump Station with a gravity sewer line.
