The Henderson County Solid Waste Division Protects Human Health and the Environment by:

- 1. Regulating the storage, collection, transportation and disposal of solid waste in Henderson County.**
- 2. Providing environmentally sound, cost-efficient solid waste disposal.**

Transportation

Transporting of solid waste shall be encased by a tarpaulin, camper cover, metal cover, rigid cover, plastic or suitable material secured to prevent leakage or blowing of materials from the vehicle. **This includes adequate coverage for bagged garbage.** Please bag all solid waste. **Loose waste results in more litter both on site and the surrounding areas.**

Bulky waste consisting of large items such as large appliances, furniture, large auto parts, trees and other oversized waste must be secured on vehicle with rope or tie-down cords.

PROHIBITED: Wastes that may not be disposed of at the solid waste facility are:

- Burning or smoldering materials
- Hazardous waste (e.g., solvents, cleaners, chemicals)
- Lead-acid batteries (e.g., vehicle batteries)
- Liquids of any kind
- Radioactive materials
- Sharps not properly contained (e.g., needles, syringes)
- Wet sludge OF ANY KIND
- Medical waste (e.g., blood wastes contaminated from hospitals and other medical facilities)
- Friable asbestos (e.g., boiler insulation, ceiling insulation)
- Stumps

Construction/Demolition Materials

All C & D materials will be disposed of in transfer station area. FEES APPLY.

Proper preparation of leftover paint in cans:

Pour an adequate amount of sand or kitty litter into paint cans. Leave uncovered overnight. Paint will solidify and may be disposed of with other municipal solid waste.



Yard Waste

Yard waste consisting solely of vegetative matter resulting from landscaping maintenance such as leaves, grass clippings, limbs and trimmings may be disposed of in the wood waste area. Tree limbs must be no greater than 10 inches in diameter at the butt end nor longer than 4 feet in length. **Fee applies.**

Sharps (e.g., needles, syringes, etc.)

Sharps must be placed in an approved, sealed, puncture-proof container prior to disposal.

Wood Waste

Wood Waste consists of tree limbs no greater than 4 feet in length. Wooden pallets also accepted. No painted or treated wood of any kind. **NO STUMPS ALLOWED. Fee applies.**

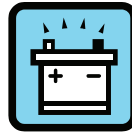
Non-friable Asbestos Only!

Asbestos materials that will not become airborne may be disposed of in the construction/demolition landfill. All building materials are disposed of in this area. **Starting July 1, 2008 all C & D materials must be disposed of in transfer station. Tipping fee applies.**

DISPOSAL GUIDELINES

Automobile Batteries

Any retailer that sells batteries will take used batteries in as trade towards a new purchase. If you are not purchasing a new battery, you may take your used automobile battery to any auto parts store. They may also be brought to Stoney Mountain free of charge



Pesticides

Henderson County collects pesticides during Household Hazardous Waste Events. Please call the Solid Waste Division for details.



Tank Disposal

55-gallon drums: Several (8 or more) holes must be made in both ends to insure emptiness. Drums may then be disposed of in the transfer station at regular fees.

Propane Tanks

Completely empty; with valve **REMOVED**, may be disposed of at regular fees.



Recyclables

Recyclables such as plastic bottles, glass, and aluminum and steel cans along with mixed paper and cardboard must be sorted into appropriate bins. These are recycled free of charge at the Stoney Mountain Recycling Convenience Center

Liquid Paint

Liquid paint is taken during Household Hazardous Waste events for \$1/ gallon. Water-based paint may also be dried and placed in the regular trash.

Kerosene and Heating Oil Tanks

Tanks up to 275-gallon capacity need both ends cut off and center section flattened. Tanks over 275-gallon capacity should be cut into sections no larger than 4 feet by 8 feet and placed into transfer station at regular fees.



Oxygen and Acetylene Tanks

Must have valve removed. Dispose in transfer station at regular fees.

Automobile Gas Tanks

Several holes should be punctured to insure emptiness. Dispose of in transfer station at regular fees.

WARNING: Cutting any tank or barrel could be extremely dangerous and should be done by professionals only.

Tire Disposal

Tires **must be removed** from rims and be free of water and mud. Tires are to be placed in designated tire trailer located in the recycling center.



The following may be disposed of **FREE OF CHARGE**, in designated areas:

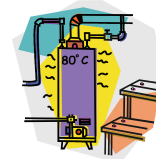


Water Heaters

Empty and dispose of in scrap metal area at no charge.

Electronics

Electronics may be brought to Stoney Mountain everyday or on Wednesday 9 am–12 pm if assistance is needed. All office and entertainment electronics may be brought in free of charge.



Batteries

All rechargeable and non-rechargeable batteries may be recycled free of charge at Stoney Mountain

Used Motor Oil and Anti-freeze

Dispose of in labeled barrel located in the recycling center. Containers must be placed in garbage bins. **Household Disposal Only—No Commercial or Fleet Disposal.**



White Goods/Metals

Refrigerators, ranges, water heaters, freezers and other similar domestic/commercial large appliances and other metal materials are disposed of in the metal area.

NO MATTRESS SPRINGS OR MICROWAVES ALLOWED. DOORS MUST BE REMOVED FROM REFRIGERATORS AND FREEZERS. ALL FOOD MUST BE REMOVED. NO ELECTRONICS IN THIS AREA.



Recycling Center: **HENDERSON COUNTY RESIDENTS ONLY.**

You may dispose of **bagged garbage** FREE OF CHARGE with equal or more amounts of recyclables.
